VOTING INSTRUCTIONS

Please Read Carefully:

1. Carefully mark your ballot by completing the arrow pointing to your choice.
2. After marking your ballot, seal it in the envelope marked SECRECY ENVELOPE. **DO NOT MARK ON THIS ENVELOPE.**
3. Place the SECRECY ENVELOPE, with your marked OFFICIAL BALLOT sealed inside, in the OFFICIAL ELECTION BALLOT ENVELOPE and seal it; then complete the oath on the back of this envelope. **Voter must sign as indicated on Voter Signature line or ballot will not be counted.**
4. Mail your ballot as soon as possible. Ballots must be received at the Arcata, CA Post Office by 12:00 Noon, June 9, 2021 or they will **NOT** be counted.
5. Ballots hand-carried to the Election Committee will **NOT** be accepted.

IMPORTANT

To assure a fair election, ballots will be stored in a locked, secure location.

To assure confidentiality, the SECRECY ENVELOPE will be removed from the OFFICIAL ELECTION BALLOT ENVELOPE before ballot counting begins.
